J.D. (1975). University of California, Berkeley. Dr. iur. University of Freiburg, Germany (1992). From 1995-2016, taught American criminal law and procedure, comparative law, international criminal law, and comparative criminal procedure at Saint Louis University. 1976-1987: Criminal defense attorney with the Alameda County Public Defender Office in California. Member of the Scientific Advisory Board of the Max-Planck-Institute for Foreign and International Criminal Law in Freiburg, Germany from 2008-2014. Elected to Board of Directors of the International Association of Penal Law in 2014. Has written on the new jury systems in Russia and Spain and new systems of about lay participation in Venezuela, Japan and Kazakhstan. The second edition of his book “Comparative Criminal Procedure: A Casebook Approach” was published in 2008 and “World Plea Bargaining” in 2010, both by Carolina Academic Press. His book: “Exclusionary Rules in Comparative Law” was published in 2013 by Springer. He has consulted on criminal procedure reform in Russia, Latvia, Georgia, Armenia, Kyrgyzstan, Kazakhstan, Indonesia and the Philippines. Writes mainly about comparative criminal procedure. Continues to teach courses in comparative criminal procedure and introduction to American criminal law and procedure at various European universities and elsewhere.
