### Prof. Sara Sun Beale



**Sara Sun Beale** is the Charles L.B. Lowndes Professor at Duke Law School. Her academic interests include the federal government's role in the criminal justice system, the laws defining federal crimes, and various issues of criminal procedure, including prosecutorial discretion. She focused recently on comparative analysis of various issues, including the regulation of prosecutorial discretion. She has lectured or taught in Australia, Brazil, Canada, England, Germany, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Luxembourg, New Zealand, the Philippines, Scotland, Spain, Switzerland, and Taiwan.

Beale is the author of dozens of articles and co-author of three books, which have been cited by the Supreme Court and lower federal courts. She has also been active in law reform efforts related to the federal government's role in criminal justice matters. Since 2005 she has served as the Reporter for the Advisory Committee on Criminal Rules, which drafts the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure.

Beale served in the Office of the Solicitor General in the U.S. Department of Justice before joining the Duke Law faculty. Beale has argued six cases in the United States Supreme Court.
